#### Fiber Arts Days by Betty Lerner

This summer the Museum has one designated Fiber Arts Saturday each month. Weavers are demonstrating in the Rotary Pavilion, the Dressmaker is at the Hoover House, and the Bandstand has been reserved for Quilters. I am hoping that some of you will join me in demonstrating quilting to the visitors 10 am – 4 pm. It is a great opportunity to teach people about quilting and its history, recruit new members and support the Museum.

Each day has a suggested theme, however, feel free to bring whatever you are working on. Not all of these themes are practical for us. Because we are outdoors, hand work is the best option.

• **Saturday, June 19th** - Birthday in the Village (An ode to how Victorian children celebrated their birthdays. Child-oriented presentation is recommended.)

• **Saturday, July 3rd** - Independence Day in the Village (A celebration of all things red, white, and blue in honor of America. Patriotic presentation is recommended.)

• **Saturday, August 28th** - Picnic in the Village (*A celebration of the rise of picnicking during the 19th century. Picnic/outdoor recreation-related presentation is recommended.*)

• **Saturday, October 2nd** - Mourning in the Village (In honor of how Victorians mourned their loved ones. Mourning-related presentation is recommended.)

Betty feels that we do not need a historian and she will chair the quilt challenge project. Mary will check the minutes from previous meetings to see which positions need to be filled.

The quilt challenges are due at the May meeting. We will vote during the break and Betty has the prizes. Betty will do the Early Bird presentation on nature printing.

The program for the May meeting will be demonstrations on using various rulers for quilting. We have three presenters who have declined a reimbursement so we may use their stipends to raffle off a ruler. The program for June will be on quilts telling a story. And in July we will celebrate "Christmas in July."

In light of BNHV's recent opening for our 2021 season and New York State's adoption on May 19, 2021 of the CDC's *Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People*, I want to provide you all with an update on our current procedures for scheduling and COVID procedures.

• BNHV will continue to require masks for visitors and staff when inside any BNHV building and when social distancing is not possible outdoors. This is because we are unable to monitor vaccination status for all guests. We thank you for helping us create a safe and enjoyable environment at BNHV for those who have not yet been able to be vaccinated and for families whose members may not all be fully vaccinated at this time.

We are glad to announce, as of **July 1**, there will no longer be any restriction on the number of meetings a Guild may hold per month (please note that capacity restrictions may still apply depending on the space in which you will hold your meetings). In other words, those of you who are accustomed to meeting every week may once again do so.

As such, please note that requests for additional meeting dates for the remainder of the 2021 calendar year should be submitted to Deirdre by **June 15<sup>th</sup>**. Please remember, space use requests are not a guarantee of space, as BNHV has many programs, camps, and other events throughout the season for which space takes priority. **All** space requests are subject to approval.

Moving forward, please note that ALL additional space use requests after June 15<sup>th</sup> and ALL set-up requests must be submitted to DEIRDRE no less than <u>two weeks in advance</u> of the requested date. Any requests that do not meet the two-week requirement or that are sent directly to Tim instead of to Deirdre <u>will not be</u> <u>accommodated</u>.

We thank you all for your patience and understanding throughout the pandemic, and for continuing to help us maintain a space that is as safe as possible for all visitors, staff, volunteers, and Guild members.

## Upcoming Events Quilt Your Science

From the American Geophysical Union (AGU):

Starting now and through November 15, 2021, individuals or groups are encouraged to create a mini quilt (between 12 inches and 24 inches on each side) that captures your own work or your passion for earth and space science research, communication, and/or education. The fabric choices and design are entirely up to the quilter, as well as the science story they want to tell with their quilt. In December 2021, there will be a virtual reality exhibition of the mini quilts (see an example of how the display will be set up in Artsteps). Quilters do not have to be AGU members to participate.

We are also planning to have a live celebration to allow in-person and virtual participants celebrate the display (pending health restrictions, the celebration will take place at the 2021 AGU Fall Meeting in New Orleans, Louisiana and online).
