October's block will be for the troops. It is 9-patch with side bars and corner blocks. The instructions are as follows:



For the 9-patch, use red and white 2 1/2" blocks in one block, and 2 1/2" blue and white blocks in another block. Square these blocks to 6 1/2".

For the side bars, you will need four 6 1/2" x 2 1/2" strips, with a 2 1/2" white corner block. Use red on the blue block, and blue on the red one. Finished size will be 10 1/2". Have fun with this!

25 quilt blocks for each block turned in.
